Indicative duties of the Full-Time Postdoctoral fellow 2006

- Working with an established team of researchers
- Generating research project income from a range of sources, maximising overhead recovery and the sustainability of the Postdoctoral fellowship beyond the initial 18 months of funding. (See point 7 of the Broad Principles document).
- Assisting with management of research projects.
- Developing a Postdoctoral learning plan.
- Taking part in Postdoctoral training opportunities, including where relevant enrichment visits to external collaborating research groups.
- The development and furtherance of a clinical academic career by building a wide range of contacts and ongoing mentored activity in both clinical and academic areas.
- To maintain, on average, one day of clinical related activity per week in support of the Postdoctoral programme of research activities. Note, that this activity is **not** rostered service and need not involve clinical activity in any one specific clinical area.
- Presenting the results of research to a range of audiences, including academics, professionals in the field and service users.
- Writing and publishing in the field of research supported by the Host NMAHP department and supporting research group.
- The development of learning materials for the NMAHP Training Scheme Seminar programme and related educational initiatives.
- Potentially contributing to the supervision of NMAHP PhD students within this training scheme and occasional contributions to related teaching.
